PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The last few weeks have been busy chasing Consumer Affairs and getting our hands on a copy of the new Model Rules and Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

We now have a copy of the new Model Rules and the Act, which come into effect as of today the 26th November.

There is a 12 month transitional period for clubs to either move over to the new rules or retain their own rules as some clubs may want to do.

However there are a number of points that clubs will need to take note of, mainly if you continue to use your own rules as your constitution, they must contain all of the new provisions set out in the new Model rules, otherwise the new rules will supersede those rules in twelve months time.

It is also essential that clubs review the new Model Rules and in conjunction with the actual Act document.

One issue that has concerned us is the statement in the "Act" that relates to;

Indemnity of office holders

The new act creates an obligation on all incorporated associations to indemnify office holders against any liability incurred in good faith on behalf of the association.

This amendment makes it a requirement for all associations to indemnify the broader category of "office holders" to include all committee members and club members who make decisions on behalf of the committee.

VAPS have now sourced an Associations Liability insurance policy that will provide the level of cover that clubs should have to protect their assets in the case where they are sued for an action taken in good faith on behalf of the committee.



This seminar was run by the society over two days and it was well supported and organised by willing club members and support from other clubs in the


region including Sale, Traralgon, Warragul and Melbourne-based clubs.

President's Report (Cont'd)

VAPS will absorb the cost of this insurance in 2013 and then review its need and consult with clubs nearer the 2013 AGM, I take the view that it is better to have this insurance than not.

Whilst there is no reference to the requirement in the Model Rules it is noted at point 87 in the Act and it is deemed that an Association using the Model Rules therefore accepts the Act as the basis of the rules and complies with the Act.

Other key changes in the new rules are:

The reforms cover the following areas:

- Codification of duties for office holders
- Defences for office holders
- Indemnity for office holders
- Tiered reporting procedures
- Merger of Public Officer / Secretary
- Removal of the prohibition on trading
- Use of technology at committee and general meetings
- New matters that must be provided for in an association's rules
- Removal of committee members
- Conflicts of interest and committee members
- Clarification of the rights of members
- Disciplinary action against a member
- Grievance procedures

I recommend club Secretaries and Executive read the PILCH summary above and then review the Model Rules document.

Note the Associations Incorporated Reform ACT 2012 document is a very large document and best saved and read as a pdf or word document.

VAPS Should...!

How often have you heard the expression "VAPS should..!" I know I have heard it often. I have used it. The phrase is usually finished with a reference to judging, providing tuition, running an interclub competition, or even setting rules for individual club competitions. We use the phrase in the same way we say "The Government should..!" It's as if there is this massive bureaucracy which should be all knowing, although it isn't; all serving, which it can't be; and can do all the things I think should be done to organise collective club photographic life because I'm more concerned with talking about it than actually doing it.

What we have is a collection of people from various camera clubs who donate their time to the administration of a body which is seen to facilitate liability insurance for the clubs and run an annual convention with an inter club competition.

VAPS maintains the Judges' List which is essential to many clubs in conducting their competitions and, in some cases, obtaining a source of external tuition for their members. It also publishes a newsletter, which you know about because you are reading it right now. And that is another in the list of "VAPS should..!" functions.

It is true that VAPS should do a lot of things. If we remember VAPS is the representative body of camera clubs in this State, that means the camera clubs could be getting a lot of things done through VAPS; using VAPS as a medium. A value of a representative body that is often overlooked is it can be, in fact should be, a forum for the presentation of ideas from its membership. It is a very effective means of getting a message about an item of common interest broadcast to other clubs.

When one joins a camera club, there is the impression the people managing the club know all about photography, administration, competitions, other clubs and anything to do with Adobe products. The reality is those club committee members may know more about these elements than some, but they are club members like everyone else and their time on the committee will not be indefinite. Active club members may reduce their administrative input at just about the time they realise how the broader system can work and what they can achieve through it. Recognition of VAPS as a resource might occur too late for them to actively apply it.

A result is there is limited input to VAPS from its sixty something member constituency (the number of clubs, not members' ages). A suggested form of input is using the newsletter as a means of letting other clubs know what activities you may have planned and would enjoy them participating in. This could be a social shoot, a presentation by a special guest speaker, or a challenge to an inter club competition. Reducing club isolation in this way can provide substantial benefits to its members.

We recognise the web as an enormous source of photographic information. Sharing comments about specific sites through the newsletter can enable other people to gain benefit from something you have found. Similarly, a critique about a course or book is information members of other clubs may appreciate. You might even like to prepare a summary of a location you visited. Newsbrief may also be an effective way to locate a speaker on a specific topic for your club.

I know there are members of clubs who believe VAPS should do a whole range of things. Maybe they should. Getting these things done is not just up to a dozen people involved in a committee. It is up to the general membership of VAPS to get some communication going between itself. From that we are more likely to come up with propositions which can be developed into resolutions for the things VAPS should..!
